



Beginning in 2017, Meaningful Use is only available in the Medicaid EHR Incentive Program for Eligible Professionals (EP) who qualify based on their Medicaid population. Medicare EPs have transitioned to the new Quality Payment Program (QPP) established by the MACRA law, which incorporates most of the Meaningful Use objectives under the new name of “Advancing Care Information” as one of the performance categories in the QPP’s Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS). Eligible Hospitals (EH) can continue to participate in both the Medicare and Medicaid EHR Incentive program as before.

The table below lists the GLHC services that can be used toward meeting certain Meaningful Use objectives by Medicaid EPs. Please note that this is only a high-level overview and that GLHC services only serve to directly or indirectly assist with specific parts of the overall MU requirements to be met in combination with a provider’s Certified EHR Technology.

Results Delivery	<p>Incorporating data such as laboratory test results is not directly measured as its own MU objective anymore, but laboratory test results and other patient data generated outside of a practice needs to be captured electronically in the EHR so that it can be made available to patients online, and for inclusion in the electronic summary of care records exchanged between health care providers. GLHC Results can deliver such data to health care providers in a structured format allowing it to be used toward meeting several downstream MU objectives and clinical quality measures.</p>
Virtual Integrated Patient Record (VIPR)	<p>Information retrieved from the VIPR Community Health Record can contribute toward meeting a number of MU objectives and clinical quality measures when it is appropriately incorporated into a health care provider’s EHR system.</p>
